


#### HARVEY CENTER - HEAD TEACHER




#### SUPRIYA SWERDLICK HERMENZE - TEACHER

### **About Our Students**

#### Students of all ages.

Our students range in age from 19 to 63, reflecting the diverse backgrounds and experiences within our community. The average age of Danbury residents is 38.9, slightly younger than the state average of 41.1.


#### They speak another language at home.

A significant portion of our students speak a language other than English at home. Approximately 42% of Danbury residents speak a language other than English, with Spanish and Portuguese being the most common. This is mirrored in our classrooms, where 55% of students speak Spanish and 41% speak Portuguese.


#### They are better educated.

In Danbury as a whole, about 57.6% of the adult residents have at least a four-year college degree. Compared to the U.S. average of 46.6%. Among our students, 29.7% have a bachelor's degree, 12.2% attended college, 28.4% graduated High School, 13.5% attended Highschool and 16.2% graduated Middle school.



Most of our students are on a proven path to success.

They work full-time in industries such as restaurants, construction, landscaping, childcare, and housekeeping. Despite their busy schedules, they dedicate four days a week, for sixteen weeks, to attending classes, completing homework, and preparing for their midterm and final exams.

Student tuition remains a fraction of community college costs and is a cornerstone of our financial sustainability. Tuition accounts for over 82% of the funds necessary to operate our school.


The majority of LVA's expenditures are dedicated to covering staff salaries and maintaining our facility. 


### **2024 NET REVENUE**
